



Change to the list of Statements of Principles, March 2021

On 5 March 2021 changes were made to the list of Australian Statements of Principles that apply in New Zealand. The Statements of Principles are a tool to determine if an injury, illness or death is service-related.

The Veterans' Support Amendment Regulations 2021 brought into force 4 new and 18 replacement Statements of Principles. These Statements of Principles cover:

- non-aneurysmal aortic atherosclerotic disease
- carotid artery disease
- renal artery atherosclerotic disease
- aplastic anaemia
- pure red cell aplasia
- chloracne
- chronic pancreatitis
- malignant neoplasm of the bone and articular cartilage
- coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-2019)
- diabetes mellitus
- retinal vascular occlusion
